

The Death and Life of the Great Lakes, by Pulitzer Prize finalist **Dan Egan**, is an interesting read about the "ecological catastrophe happening before our eyes" and the far-ranging and devastating effects of invasive mussels.

Egan details how a EPA decision, perceived harmless at the time, to not regulate the discharge of ballast water by ocean-traveling ships unleashed a "cancer" via "biological pollution which can't be fixed by plugging a pipe or capping a smokestack. It does not decay and does not disperse. It breeds."

Outdoors: Coho Derby starts this weekend

It's big, it's free and it starts here on Saturday. The sixth annual Coho Capital Derby, perhaps the largest free fishing contest on the Great Lakes, continues until June 18th.

Sponsored by the La Porte County Convention & Visitors Bureau (LCCVB), \$2,000 in cash is on the line with \$500 going for both the heaviest salmon and trout overall, plus \$100 for the biggest salmon and trout each of the five, week-long periods. "It s growing (in popularity) every year," LCCVB travel manager Rick Wright said. "When we started this back in 2012 we saw a huge, but somewhat overlooked industry — Lake Michigan fishing is a big part of Michigan City's lore and history."

Anglers were thrilled, too. Last year's salmon champ, Chris Reid of Scottville, Mich., spoke like a commercial for our home port. "This is awesome," Reid said. "I can't believe Michigan City does this. We weighed the fish, filled up with gas here, ate lunch then hit the local tackle shop." Reid's chinook weighed 21 pounds, 5 ounces and is the largest salmon registered in the history of the derby. Top trout is a 27-9 caught by Richard Skidmore of Indianapolis in 2015.

Very importantly, the rules are really simple. Just go fish and be lucky enough to catch a salmon or trout bigger than the next angler. There is no pre-registration, and all DNR rules apply. And all of Lake Michigan and its tributaries may be fished. Weigh station is at the gas dock next to the Michigan City Port Authority office in Washington Park Marina. The weigh station is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. A caught fish must be weighed within 24 hours.

Fish must be weighed at the Official Weigh Station located at Michigan City Port Authority, 200 Heisman Harbor Drive, Michigan City, IN (219) 872-1712.

Prizes to be awarded at the Skwait Post 451, 121 Skwait Legion Ave., Michigan City, IN (time and date to be determined).

All State and Federal sport fishing regulations apply to anglers entering fish in this contest.

Eligible fish must be weighed at the official weigh station within 24 hours of being caught.

Contest Waters are all of the Great Lakes and all Great Lakes Tributaries.

Fish are subject to inspection by contest judges and may be disallowed at the discretion of contest judges. In case of dispute, the decision of the contest judges is final.

2017 HCC CLUB TOURNAMENTS

The 2017 HCC-sponsored tournament to determine the Club Champion will use a derby format. A boat/crew must fish three of the four tournament dates to be eligible to be will named Club Champion.

The captain of the boat entered must be a member of the Hoosier Coho Club in good standing (dues paid for 2017) in order to enter this tournament.

Tournament Dates are: June 10&11 July 1&2 August 12&13 September 2,3,&4.

Fishing will start at 12:01 AM on the first day and will conclude at the weigh-in at 3:00 PM on the final day.

Entry fee will \$50 per boat and a \$25 fee for big fish for each of the tournament dates with the exception of the June 10&11 tournament (which will be free for all club members). Prizes totaling \$1,000 will be paid in the form of Bass Pro and/or Cabela's gift cards for the top three places as well as big fish.
